

**2008 Virginia General Assembly  
Legislative Report  
2/9/2008**

The three major areas of legislation affecting VUHCC members continues to be:

**Transportation Funding  
Immigration/Hiring Restrictions  
Truck Related Legislation**

A sidebar issue that is also important is the homebuilder's push to eliminate proffers and enhance the use of impact fees. Let's start with this legislation.

Homebuilders have launched a major legislative initiative to prohibit the future imposition of proffers and substitute a new system of impact fees capped at \$5000 per house (that number is certainly negotiable at this stage of the legislation).

Impact fees are now available to cities and counties with growth of 15% or more a year or that have populations of 20,000 or more and are experiencing annual growth of 5% or more, annually. Impact fees, under the current law can only be applied to road improvements.

Proffers are negotiated with developers at the time of rezoning but are paid when the developer applies for building permits on the individual lots. The revenue can be used for a broad range of infrastructure needs such as roads, schools, libraries, and other services.

Current impact fees are normally less than \$10,000 per home when they are applied. Proffers on the other hand can run as much as \$47,000 per lot in northern Virginia to about \$18,000 in the Richmond area. Builders feel they are being held hostage to paying any amount of proffer fee requested in order to obtain zoning. Local governments say that substituting the current proffer option for the proposed new impact fee will hurt them financially, and cause them to fall farther behind in the battle to keep up with high growth in many areas of the state.

The legislation taking proffers away and substituting an expanded use of impact fees has now been debated by two Senate committees, and is now before the full Senate. The builders hope to press on, but the local government lobbyists are fighting hard for the legislation (SB 768) to be carried over so that they can better determine how localities will be impacted and what changes might need to be made to the legislation in order for them to support it. There is lots of fight left in both the proponents and opponents of this legislation, and plenty of time left for the legislature to "tweak", pass, or kill this legislation. VUHCC is supportive of the homebuilders position, but cautions that moving forward without seeking some compromises might end up with the bill becoming law, and localities substantially

slowing down the rezoning process in the future. If that happens, no one will have won.

### **Transportation Funding**

No additional news since last week's report. VUHCC is planning to have some discussions with key legislators next week to explore options for replacing the abusive driver fees and perhaps generating new revenue streams for transportation. It is, however, very early in the process to offer any insights as to what may happen in this area except to say that there is little hope of any legislation emerging at this session that will generate any substantial and new transportation dollars.

The legislation to create a Richmond transportation authority similar to the ones now in place in Hampton Roads and northern Virginia was carried over this week as local government officials opposed any such action, despite the pleas of businesses groups to the contrary. Central Virginia is heading down a path that does not portend well for long-term transportation planning and funding for the region. Even more disturbing is the fact that local governments in the region see very little reason to even talk with each other about this matter!

In northern Virginia a bill has passed the Senate (SB 729) that would allow the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority to impose an additional 1/2 cent sales tax in the region and do away with three components of last year's legislation giving the NVTa taxing authority. Those three components are the additional 1% titling tax on car sales, the application of sales tax on auto repair work, and the additional \$10 vehicle inspection fee. This change, if passed, would actually generate more dollars than the current tax applications. The bill has passed the Senate 30 to 10.

The Senate has also passed legislation giving only the General Assembly the power to approve tolls on Interstate I-81. This bill sets a tone for future debate as to who should have tolling authority on other roads in Virginia.

### **Immigration**

Of the over 100 bills introduced on immigration at this session, the ones that concern VUHCC members have been narrowed down to three bills. HB 926, SB 517, and SB 782. The language in these bills represent the best that business can get in the current atmosphere on this subject. All three bills seem to address immigration, but in my opinion do place any new or unnecessary burdens on employers, If we can make this issue go away by complying with the language in these three bills, we can declare a victory. It could have been MUCH worse.

### **Truck Legislation**

I have discussed the status of truck legislation in last week's report. There have been no changes in this area since that time.

### Other

VUHCC testified against two bills by Delegate Jeff Frederick (HB 1027 and HB 1030) this week. These bills would have not allowed some employees of VUHCC companies to park their vehicles in front of their homes, and would have required VUHCC employers doing business with the state to develop and implement telecommuting policies for at least some of their workers. Both bills were killed.

Next week the Senate and House begin considering each other's bills, and discussions about the new state budget will begin in earnest.
