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As the General Assembly begins its first full week of deliberations and Governor Bob McDonnell prepares to deliver his first address to the House and Senate Monday, there are several important issues that are likely to define the 2010 General Assembly Session:

The New General Assembly:

As a result of the November elections, the House of Delegates has 20 new members, which is one of the largest freshman classes in recent memory (the number of House freshmen will increase to 21 in early March with a special election in Fairfax County to fill the seat of Delegate Dave Marsden (D-Fairfax County), who won a special election to fill the vacancy in the Senate left by the election of Attorney General Ken Cuccinelli). The Republicans increased their majority in the House of Delegates by six seats. The new partisan split in the House is 59 Republicans, 38 Democrats, 2 Independents (both of whom vote with the Republicans), and one vacancy. Republicans gained an additional seat on each standing committee.

On the Senate side, the unexpected victory of Dave Marsden constituted a pick-up for the Democrats, and has expanded their majority to 22 versus 18 Republican members. The special election victory of Jeff McWaters allowed Senate Republicans

to hold on to the Virginia Beach Senate seat of Ken Stolle, who was elected that city's Sheriff.

The Budget:

The Commonwealth is suffering under some of the most prolonged and difficult budget conditions in a generation. The budget offered by outgoing Governor Tim Kaine features general fund spending reductions totaling \$1.2 billion for the remainder of FY 10, \$2 billion for FY 11, and \$2.1 billion for FY 12, for a total of \$5.3 billion. Revenues have been falling far short of the amount required to support the base budget (general fund revenues for FY 2010 are currently close to FY 2005 levels). In fact, the revenue forecast for FY 2010 is projected to decline by 2.7%, which represents the first time in recorded budget history that the Commonwealth has experienced revenue declines in two successive years.

In addition to significant cuts in general fund spending, Governor Kaine's budget contained proposals that would generate revenues, including the controversial proposal that would eliminate the reimbursement to the localities for personal property tax relief. The elimination of the car tax would provide an additional \$1.9 billion over the biennium. Governor Kaine has recommended replacing the partial car tax reimbursement payments with a total repeal of the tax and a new 1% income tax surcharge phased in over two years as a dedicated source of local revenue. The Republican controlled House of Delegates and Governor Bob McDonnell have called Governor Kaine's proposals to generate revenues through tax increases "dead on arrival". While the members of the General Assembly are likely to reject Kaine's tax increases, they might very well embrace many of the spending reductions suggested by the outgoing Governor because politically, it will be easier to "credit" Kaine with some of the unpopular reductions in spending on core service areas such as education, health care, and public safety. If, as expected, the General Assembly rejects some or all of Governor Kaine's proposals aimed at generating additional general fund revenues, House and Senate budget leaders will be forced to make nearly \$2 billion in additional cuts to the budget.

Legislators in both chambers and on both sides of the aisle are already discussing the possibility that, given the magnitude of the budget shortfall, it will be likely that the legislative session, scheduled to adjourn on March 13, may need to be extended. It is clear that any legislative priorities offered either from a member of the General Assembly or from the Governor McDonnell that has a general fund price tag attached will have difficulty receiving approval. This could certainly limit a number of Governor McDonnell's legislative package. For his part, Governor McDonnell had opted against offering an alternative budget plan, even though he has rejected large portions of Governor Kaine's budget proposals. The Governor's unwillingness to offer concrete details regarding his budget plans has prompted some tough rhetoric

from Senate Democrats. Senator Janet Howell (D-Fairfax County) said that “The most important thing a governor does is propose a budget. He’s going AWOL on that...It approaches a dereliction of duty.”

A Cabinet Confirmation Fight Avoided:

One of the first substantial challenges facing the new McDonnell Administration was the confirmation fight over the Governor’s Secretary of Commerce and Trade selection, Robert Sledd. Sledd, who was the CEO of Richmond-based Performance Food Group Company, came under intense fire from Senate Democrats because he intended to continue serving on three corporate boards. Despite Sledd’s intention to place his financial assets into a blind trust, critics said that Sledd’s membership on the corporate boards represented a conflict of interest. Senate Democrats promised to block the appointment. Instead of going through the confirmation process, Governor McDonnell chose to appoint Sledd to be his “Senior Economic Advisor” (a position that will not require General Assembly approval). Governor McDonnell appointed James Cheng, who was tapped to be the Deputy Secretary of Commerce and Trade, to fill the Secretary position.

Governor McDonnell’s Priorities:

The Governor has made it clear that the remainder of the General Assembly Session will be dedicated first and foremost to dealing with the budget shortfall and working toward policies that promote job creation and economic development opportunities throughout the state. It has been widely speculated that Governor McDonnell intended to call the General Assembly into special session to address issues related to transportation funding sometime this spring. However, recent statements indicate that a special session this year for transportation is not at all a settled matter. Late last week McDonnell announced that he did not intend to propose a comprehensive transportation package during the 2010 General Assembly session. Instead, Governor McDonnell has said we will push the following transportation proposals during the session:

- Open the 18 rest stops closed because of budget cuts
- Raise the speed limit on portions of rural interstates
- Promote Public-Private Transportation projects (PPTAs)
- Issue bonds that were approved by the transportation package passed in 2007 (HB 3202).

Legislation of Interest:

Members have until January 22 to introduce bills. Some legislation of special interest that has been offered includes the following:

Transportation Funding:

Several bills have been offered related to increasing the gas tax and/or offering an indexing mechanism. HB 230 sponsored by Delegate Vivian Watts (D-Fairfax County), HB 269 sponsored by Delegate David Englin (D-Alexandria), HB 1153 sponsored by Delegate Jim Scott (D-Fairfax County), and SB 223 sponsored by Senator George Barker (D-Fairfax County) are all gas tax-related bills that will have a difficult time gaining traction in the House of Delegates.

Delegate Glen Oder (R-Newport News) has introduced HB 404, which provides for additional transportation funding linked to the growth in the marine terminals in Hampton Roads for the Hampton Roads Construction District, growth in various state tax sources attributable to the citizens of Northern Virginia for the Northern Virginia Construction District, the growth in revenues from the port of Richmond and the Inland Port for the Richmond and Staunton Construction Districts respectively, and the growth the Elliston Intermodal rail facility for the Salem Construction District. This bill is very similar to a measure that passed the House and failed in the Senate last year.

HB 971 sponsored by Delegate Tom Rust (R-Fairfax County) provides additional funding for statewide maintenance by imposing a fee on motor fuels sold by a distributor to a retail dealer. The bill would also increase both the state sales tax and the recordation tax in Northern Virginia for transportation projects in the region. The suggested tax increases would not become effective until the unemployment rate in the Commonwealth is equal to or lower than it was in January 2008 for six consecutive months.

Several members have offered bills that would dedicate to transportation a percentage of any revenues realized from royalties paid to the Commonwealth as a result of offshore natural gas and oil drilling, including HB 756 (Delegate Chris Stolle, R-Virginia Beach), HB 805 (Charles Poindexter, R-Franklin County), HB 900 (Delegate Barbara Comstock, R-Fairfax County), and SB 601 (Senator Frank Wagner, R-Virginia Beach).

Senate Minority Leader Tommy Norment (R-James City County) has introduced SB 513, which would authorize wagering on simulcast horse racing, with half of the proceeds going to the Transportation Trust Fund. This bill has been offered in previous General Assembly sessions, and has had difficulty, particularly in the House of Delegates.

Overweight Trucks:

Several bills revise (and in most cases increase) fees related to overload and overweight permits. These bills include HB 37 (Delegate Bob Marshall, R-Prince

William County), HB 1068 (Delegate Clay Athey, R-Warren County), and SB 212 (Senator George Barker, D-Fairfax County).

Restriction on Cell Phones:

Legislators on both sides of the aisle and in both chambers have offered several pieces of legislation that would extend the prohibition on the use of wireless telecommunications devices in motor vehicles unless the device is configured for hands-free operation. This follows last year's ban on texting while operating a motor vehicle. The bills that have been offered on this subject include HB 58 (Delegate Roslyn Dance, D-Petersburg), HB 783 (Delegate Jim LeMunyon, R-Fairfax County), SB 10 (Senator Harry Blevins, R-Chesapeake), and SB 517 (Senator Tommy Norment, R-James City County).

Sewer laterals:

Delegate Bob Purkey has offered HB 115, which would establish a set of requirements for the protection of sewer system laterals and private sewer laterals that are unique from the general requirements of the Underground Utility Damage Prevention Act. Delegate Lee Ware has introduced the same bill and will be the chief patron for this legislation, which VUHCC has been working on for over 14 months.

ABC Privatization

One of Governor McDonnell's signature proposals for transportation is the privatization of the Commonwealth's ABC stores. Three members have introduced bills on the subject that range from studying the issue of privatization (HJ 91 sponsored by Delegate Bob Purkey, R-Virginia Beach) to legislation that auctions licenses to authorize the retail sale of alcohol (HB 342 sponsored by Delegate Bob Marshall, R-Prince William County and SB 443 sponsored by Senator Mark Obenshain, R-Harrisonburg).

Electronic Work Verification Program:

HB 737 (Delegate Dave Albo, R-Fairfax County) and SB 225 (Senator George Barker, D-Fairfax County) have been offered that would require public contractors and subcontractors to register and participate in the federal E-Verify program to determine that workers are legally eligible for employment.
