

**2010 Virginia General Assembly**  
**Legislative Report**  
**3/7/2010**

**Budget:**

The budget negotiations between the House and Senate conferees have begun in earnest in an effort to hammer out the differences between the two budget documents ahead of the General Assembly's scheduled March 13 adjournment. The conferees have had a difficult time agreeing on a basic framework for their discussions. The House negotiators believe that it is essential to mutually agree on the revenues available, while the Senate negotiators prefer to examine expenditures first. In light of the fact that the Senate and House budgets are approximately half a billion dollars apart in terms of revenue, the discussions regarding expenditures versus revenues are obviously critically important.

The Senate budget document has approximately \$280 million of additional revenue assumptions (this includes projections for proceeds from land-preservation tax credits and tobacco taxes) as well as over \$220 million in fees. The House budget has neither of these elements. Late last week, House negotiators, as expected, moved off of their "no fee increase" position and offered to accept about \$76 million in new fees (including a \$10 increase in the deed recordation fee and a \$10 increase in court fees). The House proposal is merely the opening offer in an effort to bridge the \$500 million gap between the two budget documents. Whatever revenue figure the budget conferees agree to, it will be lower than the Senate's original assumptions, which will likely require the Senate to concede to less spending to cover the loss in revenue.

In terms of spending items, the Senate and House budgets differ substantially in the areas of public education, public safety, health care, and economic development. These are the items that will likely receive the most attention during the week's budget negotiations. It is certain that the compromise budget document will include cuts of unprecedented proportions in core service areas.

**Special Session for Transportation:**

Council lobbyists have had the opportunity to discuss the prospects of a special session dedicated to transportation funding issues with senior members of the McDonnell administration, as well as well as members of the House and Senate leadership. Last week, Governor McDonnell said that once the budget was behind

him, he would begin looking ahead to funding transportation as well as restructuring state government (restructuring state government would likely include the privatization of the state's ABC stores which is a critical component of Governor McDonnell's transportation funding package). It is possible that either one of these issues could trigger a special session before the end of the year.

Governor McDonnell has said that he will not call a special transportation session unless there is general agreement among the leadership in the House and the Senate. Private discussions with both administration officials and legislative leaders illustrate that there is, at this point, nothing close to a blueprint to begin garnering such an agreement. Administration officials have asked for patience from the industry regarding a special session. They have said that addressing transportation funding in a special session is a top priority for Governor McDonnell, and it is the Governor's intention to address the issue before the end of the year.

Legislative leaders have reported that there have been no serious discussions regarding a possible special session for transportation. One influential House Republican leader questioned how such a session could even work given the fact that any meaningful debate on transportation funding requires examining new sources of revenues, and focusing almost exclusively on the privatization of ABC stores is an unrealistic solution to the problem.

### **Legislation of Interest:**

#### *Public Private Transportation Act (PPTA):*

Governor McDonnell, using his constitutionally mandated authority to send a bill down at any time during the legislative session for the General Assembly's consideration, sent down a PPTA bill patroned by Delegate Jimmie Massie (R-Henrico County). HB 1395 is similar to a bill offered earlier in the session by Senator Walter Stosch (R-Henrico County), which was narrowly defeated in the Senate Finance Committee. HB 1395 authorizes state agencies and state authorities, upon the approval of the Governor, to enter into either PPTA or Public Private Education Act (PPEA) agreements for projects that allow the private entity to be paid grants from a portion of the growth in state taxes attributable to the development of the project. Supporters of the concept argue that the measure will provide increased incentives for the private sector to participate in either PPTA or PPEA projects. Opponents of the bill counter that the details on how this valuation process would work from a practical perspective are at best, vague. After some heated debate in a subcommittee of the House General Laws Committee, the measure was reported out

on a 5-2 vote. The bill will be considered by the full General Laws Committee on Monday. The bill has strong support from the House Republican majority, which makes its passage out of the body likely, but it will face an uncertain future in the Senate, particularly since the Senate Finance Committee has rejected a similar proposal earlier in the session.

*Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel:*

Delegate Glenn Oder (R-Newport News) offered House Joint Resolution 81, which requests VDOT to implement the recommendations of an Independent Review Panel that examined the mishap at the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel that resulted in the tunnel being flooded last summer. The resolution calls for a report on the status of the panel's recommended changes to the Joint Commission on Transportation Accountability. This resolution was non-controversial, passing the House unanimously. The bill was rejected by the Senate Rules Committee, which in and of itself is not remarkable. It is worth highlighting, however, because Rules Committee member, Senator Yvonne Miller (D-Norfolk), who also chairs the Senate Transportation Committee, led the charge to kill the resolution because she believed that the measure was nothing more than a "diversion" to take attention away from the lack of new funding she believes is needed to fix Virginia's deteriorating road network. The death of this minor measure highlights the frustration some members are beginning to demonstrate toward bills that do not substantively address the state's growing infrastructure needs.

*Electronic Work Verification Program:*

HB 737, which is sponsored by Delegate Dave Albo (R-Fairfax County), requires E-verify to be used by state and local governments in hiring new employees. The bill will be heard by the Senate Commerce and Labor Committee on Monday. This is the same committee which killed a much broader E-verify bill patroned by Senator George Barker (D-Fairfax County). While Delegate Albo's measure will not directly impact contractors, it is a measure that still is potentially harmful because it is the first step in requiring E-verify for contractors who do public work, and eventually, all contractors who do work in the Commonwealth (Delegate Albo's original bill would have required the use of E-verify for all Virginia businesses above a certain employment threshold, so it is clear that this measure is the proverbial camel's nose under the tent). We will continue to oppose this bill, and are working to ensure that the budget conferees do not include language in the budget that would allow this policy to be implemented (the House budget includes language that mirrors HB 737). If the budget language is included in the conference committee report, E-verify

will be required to be utilized by state and local governments. We have asked budget conferees to strip this language out of the budget.
