

Virginia General Assembly  
Legislative Report  
January 16, 2011

Please find attached your first weekly status report, expertly prepared by Mr. Myles Louria - a key member of the VUHCC lobbying team at Hunton Williams - on matters of interest coming before the 2011 session of the Virginia General Assembly. You will note from the attached matrix that although the session is only a few days old, there are already large numbers of bills that impact our memberships. Myles has highlighted the most important of those to date, below. Many more bills will be dropped in by the end of next week, so expect the matrix to grow significantly.

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**The 2011 General Assembly:**

The 2011 Virginia General Assembly session convened on January 12th and will be in session for 46-days with a scheduled adjournment date of February 26 (the General Assembly will meet again on April 6 to consider amendments and vetoes by Governor Bob McDonnell of legislation passed during the regular session). General Assembly members will be considering over 2,000 pieces of legislation during the session.

One of the notable issues that will cast a long shadow over the proceedings of the 2011 General Assembly session will be the decennial redistricting process, which will redraw the political map for members of the General Assembly and the congressional delegation. Redrawing political lines can radically shift the partisan make-up of the state House and Senate by helping to solidify and in some cases augment each chamber's respective majority for the foreseeable future (the Republicans hold the majority in the House while the Democrats control the State Senate). Legislators will be wondering what their districts might look like, or, in some cases, if they will even have a district they recognize once the process is concluded.

In addition to redistricting, 2011 is also an election year for all 140 members of the House and Senate. With legislators facing both redistricting and re-election, there will no doubt be additional emphasis placed on the calculus of how any one of a number of issues could impact their individual political fortunes.

As was the case last session, budget considerations (and in many cases, constraints) will still be a major issue driving much of the debate during the session. While the General Assembly will not be faced with the difficult task of closing a \$4.2 billion budget gap as was the case last session, the members will still face very difficult budget decisions not only because of the slow economic recovery but also because the federal stimulus money, which provided substantial help in plugging a number of budget holes (particularly in the health and human services areas), will no longer be available.

### **Governor McDonnell's Agenda and Transportation Funding:**

Governor McDonnell has outlined a very ambitious agenda for the 2011 session, which is highlighted by reforming state government and investments in economic development, higher education, and transportation.

In terms of transportation funding, the Governor is pushing a transportation package, that, if fully implemented will pump \$4 billion into road and transit projects over the next three years which could fund over 900 projects throughout the Commonwealth. The funding package is based primarily on utilizing existing general fund revenue, accelerating the sales of bonds approved by the General Assembly in 2007, and issuing additional bonding over the next several years (of the \$4 billion package, \$2.9 billion would be generated through bonding). The following are the specifics of the Governor's plan include:

- Creates the Virginia Transportation Infrastructure Bank that will provide low interest rate loans and grants to localities, transportation and transit authorities as well as to private sector partners. The Bank will be capitalized with \$150 million in excess general fund revenues and \$250 million from a portion of the funds discovered as a result of the VDOT completed last year to equal \$400 million.
- Authorizes the use of \$1.1 billion in Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicles ("GARVEE") funds. GARVEE bonds are sold for specific construction projects. They allow investors to be repaid through the use of future federal highway funds.
- Accelerates the sales of bonds from the 2007 transportation package to a maximum of \$600 million per year.
- Appropriates \$50 million to recapitalize the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund.
- Designates 0.25 percent of the sales tax generated in Northern Virginia and Hampton Roads to transportation projects in those two regions. The portion of the sales tax would equal approximately \$90 million for Northern Virginia and \$50 million for Hampton Roads.
- Privatizes the retail portion of the state's ABC operations, which will generate a one time, upfront payment of \$300 million for transportation.

## **Legislation of Interest:**

Members have until January 21 to introduce bills. Some legislation of special interest that has been offered thus far includes the following:

### *Transportation Funding:*

Several bills have been offered related to increasing the gas tax and/or offering a gas tax indexing mechanism, including: HB 1413 sponsored by Delegate Jim Scott (D-Fairfax County), which converts the gas tax from a cents per gallon to a percentage tax and HB 1531 sponsored by Delegate Algie Howell (D-Norfolk), which increases the gas tax by 10 cents. It is worth drawing attention to Delegate Bob Purkey (R-Virginia Beach), who has offered HB 1653 and HB 154 which would provide increases in the gas tax subject to referendum (HB 1653 would increase the gas tax at the wholesale level, while HB 1654 would increase or decrease the motor fuel tax rates each year by the annual average percentage increase or decrease in the retail price of motor fuel). Delegate Purkey, who is the Chairman of the House Finance Committee, is thus far, the only Republican to suggest an increase in the fuels tax.

HB 1892 sponsored by Delegate Vivian Watts is a comprehensive transportation funding bill that would increase the gas tax for maintenance statewide (while decreasing the sales tax on food), and would increase the sales and recordation tax in Northern Virginia, and increase the commercial property tax rate in Hampton Roads. Senator John Edwards (D-Fairfax County) and Senator John Miller (D-Newport News) have also offered comprehensive funding bills (SB 1242 and SB 1295 respectively) both bills feature increases in the gas tax and sales tax on cars (Senator Edwards' bill also includes a motor vehicle rental tax increase, while Senator Miller includes a tolling provision).

Instead of increases in gas and sales tax, Delegate Glenn Oder (R-Newport News) has introduced HB 2222, which provides for additional transportation funding linked to the growth in state tax revenues associated with the marine terminals in Hampton Roads designated for the Hampton Roads Construction District; the growth in various state tax sources attributable to the citizens of Northern Virginia for the Northern Virginia Construction District; the growth in revenues from the port of Richmond and the Inland Port for the Richmond and Staunton Construction Districts respectively; and the growth the Elliston Intermodal rail facility for the Salem Construction District. This bill is very similar to a measure that Delegate Oder offered last year.

Senator Tommy Norment (R-James City County) is offering a bill that would authorize wagering on simulcast horse races, with a portion of the profits going to transportation. SB 1347 is similar to a bill that Senator Norment has offered over the last several years. The bill is usually killed in the House.

It is unlikely that any of these revenue bills will be a viable vehicle for transportation funding as the session moves forward. It appears that the funding package offered by Governor McDonnell, with the main legislative components being offered by Speaker Bill Howell (R-Stafford County) and Senator William Wampler (R-Bristol), will serve as the most likely chance for meaningful transportation funding this legislative session. However, it should be noted that members of the Senate Democratic leadership have expressed serious concerns regarding the Governor's

transportation package. Senate Majority Leader Dick Saslaw (D-Fairfax County) has publicly questioned the use of debt in the Governor's transportation package.

*Restriction on Cell Phones and Texting:*

Legislators on both sides of the aisle and in both chambers have offered several pieces of legislation that would extend the prohibition on the use of wireless telecommunications devices in motor vehicles unless the device is configured for hands-free operation, and other legislators have offered bills increasing penalties for texting while driving. The bills that have been offered on this subject include HB 1404 (Delegate Algie Howell, D-Norfolk), HB 1224 (Delegate Rosalyn Dance, D-Petersburg), HB 1489 (Delegate Lionell Spruill, D-Chesapeake), HB 1546 (Delegate Kay Kory, D-Fairfax), SB 1042 (Senator George Barker, D-Fairfax County), and SB 1351 (Senator Tommy Norment, R-James City County). As was the case last session, these bills will likely end up in the House Militia, Police, and Public Safety Committee where they will be defeated.

*Electronic Work Verification Program:*

Several bills have been offered expanding and mandating the use of the federal Electronic Work Verification Program (known as "E-Verify"). HB 1859 (Delegate Rich Anderson, R-Prince William County) requires state agencies to include in every contract over \$50,000 a provision requiring contractors to use E-Verify. SB 1288 (Senator Jeff McWaters) requires the use of E-Verify for all public contractors and subcontractors. HB 2333 (Delegate Scott Lingamfelter, R-Prince William County) provides a bid preference for contractors that use E-Verify. These bills represent an aggressive expansion of E-Verify. Last year, the VUHCC helped lead the fight on this issue, and successfully limited the scope of E-Verify to agencies of the Commonwealth. It is unclear at this point the support these bills will have among members of the General Assembly.

*Overweight Trucks:*

HB 2022, sponsored by House Transportation Chairman Joe May (R-Loudon County) directs the Commissioner of the Department of Motor Vehicles, in consultation with the VDOT Commissioner, and the Executive Director of the Virginia Port Authority, to develop a comprehensive, tiered schedule of fees for overweight vehicles. The proposed fee structure would be presented to the Joint Commission on Transportation Accountability by December 15, 2011. Since this bill does not enact a new fee schedule, members of the General Assembly may be willing to move forward on the overweight truck issue.
