Legislative Report

In the report below VUHCC lobbyist Myles Louria has done an excellent job summarizing VUHCC actions and the current status of legislation in two very important areas - E-Verify and the Taking of Property. I call you attention to both of these issues.

Next week you will receive VUHCC's final legislative report for the 2011 Regular Session, which is scheduled to adjourn on 2/26.

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The Session's Final Week:

As the General Assembly heads into its final week, much of the attention will be focused on the deliberations of the House and Senate budget conferees who are charged with reconciling the significant differences between the two chamber's respective budget documents. The budget conferees on the House side are: Delegate Lacey Putney (I-Bedford), Delegate Kirk Cox (R-Colonial Heights), Delegate Beverly Sherwood (R-Frederick County), Delegate Chris Jones (R-Suffolk), Delegate Steve Landes (R-Augusta County), and Delegate Johnny Joannou (D-Portsmouth). On the Senate side,

the conferees are: Senator Chuck Colgan (D-Prince William County), Senator Ed Houck (D-Spotsylvania County), Janet Howell (D-Fairfax County), Senator Dick Saslaw (D-Fairfax County), Senator Walter Stosch (R-Henrico County), Senator William Wampler (R-Bristol), and Senator Tommy Norment (R-James City County).

The two sides are far apart on a variety of issues regarding the two chamber's respective amendments to the state's two-year, \$78 billion budget. These differences in the two budget documents include K-12 education (\$100 million difference), Medicaid provider rates (\$105 million difference), and the use of state debt (\$523 million difference).

As discussed last week, one of the major areas of difference between the two budgets is general fund support for transportation. The House budget includes \$150 million in general funds to help capitalize the proposed Commonwealth Infrastructure Bank. The Senate chose not to include any general fund revenues for transportation. The battle over this funding decision continues to rage in the House of Delegates, where Democrats have railed against the House's funding decision over the passed several weeks. As House Minority Leader Ward Armstrong (D-Henry County) put it, "There is very much a war going on in the House of Delegates right now. You cannot rob schools, police and the mentally challenged to pay for roads".

Transportation Funding:

HB 2527, sponsored by Speaker Bill Howell (R-Stafford County) and SB 1446 sponsored by Senator William Wampler (R-Bristol) and Senator Chuck Colgan (D-Prince William County) will be placed in conference early next week in order to work out the differences between the two bills.

Despite early discussions and criticisms regarding the use of debt financing to fund the Governor's transportation package (Senate and House Democrats had grumbled that the packages' heavy reliance on debt would hamstring future governors), both the House and Senate bills would authorize approximately \$4 billion in debt to fund road and transit projects over the next three years. The transportation package contemplated in these bills represents the largest one-time infusion of capital for building new roads and maintaining existing ones in decades. The bi-partisan supporters of the funding package maintain that unprecedented low interest rates and construction costs favor utilizing the state's coveted Triple A bond rating to fund the Governor's infrastructure package.

.The major difference between the two bills is the use of general fund revenues. The Senate stripped \$150 million in general funds from the bill (as mentioned above, the Senate budget does not contain any additional general fund revenues for transportation). The Senate (along with House Democrats) has argued that general fund money should go to other core services such as schools, public safety, and health care. The conference committee will need to fashion a compromise regarding the use of general fund revenues before the General Assembly concludes on February 26.

E-Verify:

A special subcommittee of the Senate Courts of Justice Committee killed HB 1727, patroned by Delegate Bill Carrico (R-Grayson), which would have required public contractors and employers

with 15 or more employees to enroll in the E-Verify Program for newly hired employees (Employers and contractors that fail to do so would have been subject to suspension or revocation of permits and/or licenses issued by either the state or local government). The Subcommittee also killed HB 2333, sponsored by Delegate Scott Lingamfelter (R-Prince William County, which provided that in the event of a tie bid, a preference would be given in the bid process for contractors employing the E-Verify Program. Delegate Carrico and Delegate Lingamfelter both refused to have their bills rolled into HB 1859, sponsored by Delegate Rich Anderson (R-Prince William County). Delegate Anderson's bill was amended and is now identical to Senate Bill 1049 patroned by Senator George Barker. Senator Barker's bill is the compromise E-Verify legislation that VUHCC helped to negotiate. SB 1049 provides that any employer with 50 or more employees for the previous 12 month period must use E-Verify for newly hired employees when entering into a contract with the state that is in excess of \$50,000. The bill would become effective December 1, 2013. The House Courts of Justice Committee will be considering Senator Barker's bill early this week. It has been made clear to the House leadership that the Senate will only embrace an E-Verify program as it is envisioned in Senator Barker's bill. Consequently, the House has somewhat limited options in terms of how it may choose to deal with Senator Barker's bill. If the body tries to amend the bill, Senator Barker has pledged to reject the amendments. It appears that the only E-Verify bill that can survive the General Assembly will be the one that VUHCC helped to negotiate.

Taking of Private Property:

House Joint Resolution 693, sponsored by Delegate Johnny Joannou (D-Portsmouth) is an amendment to the Virginia Constitution which states that no private property shall be damaged or taken except in cases where it is for a public use without just compensation to its owner. In addition, no additional private property may be taken over and above what is necessary to achieve the stated public use. Resolutions suggesting changes to the Virginia Constitution must be passed in two General Assembly sessions that are separated by an intervening election, so this resolution must be passed again by the 2012 General Assembly. The Senate Privileges and Elections Committee added an amendment to the Resolution that states, "Just compensation shall be no less than the value of the property taken, business goodwill and access lost, damages to the residue caused by the taking, and damages to adjacent property caused by the taking." It is impossible to calculate terms like "goodwill and access lost", or to quantify damage to adjacent properties. Consequently, VUHCC testified against the Resolution, pointing out that the Senate amendment would have a negative impact on the ability to proceed with almost any infrastructure project. The Senate Privileges and Elections Committee narrowly reported the bill to the full Senate on an 8-7 vote. VUHCC, along with a variety of other business interests, are currently lobbying members of the Senate to reject the Committee amendments to HJR 693. A vote on the measure is expected early in the week.

Restriction on Cell Phones and Texting:

As expected, the remaining proposals to restrict texting and cell phone use by drivers were defeated in a House Militia, Police and Public Safety Subcommittee. The Subcommittee killed similar House sponsored legislation earlier in the Session. The Subcommittee killed both Senator George Barker's SB 1042, which would have made texting while driving a primary offense (it is currently a secondary offense, meaning violators may be cited only after being

stopped for another offense), and SB 1351 (patroned by Senator Tommy Norment), which would have prohibited the use of cell phones unless they were configured for hands free operation.
