As the session heads into its final two weeks, VUHCC still has some important issues that remain unresolved. Political issues may cause a repeat of the budget deadlock of a few years ago when under Governor Kaine, Senators could not agree to pass a budget. It is also now pretty clear that if any of the remaining legislation regarding new transportation funding is passed, they will be nowhere near adequate to meet the needs. And this week we are still having to focus on important mechanic's lien (HB 1265) and bonding (HB 945) legislation. Read more on these and other important legislative matters in the report below.

Budget Stalemate:

Last Thursday, the full House and Senate considered their respective budget bills. The House passed out their budget with a relatively strong measure of bi-partisan support (79) members supported the budget, with 21 Democrats voting against the measure, principally because of the increase of the share of sales tax dollars for transportation). The vote in the Senate was a completely different matter. The Senate budget bill did not receive the 21 votes necessary to pass the measure. All 20 Republicans supported the bill, while the chamber's Democrats opposed the bill (the Lieutenant Governor is not permitted constitutionally to break tie votes on budget matters, so the bill could not receive the necessary 21 votes to pass). The Senate's rejection of its own budget is an unprecedented event. The Democrats' opposition to the bill was not rooted in the document itself (the Republicans on the Senate Finance Committee ensured that the budget document included many of the Senate Democrats priorities - including the removal of additional general fund dollars for transportation). The Democrats' primary objection, which has been expressed consistently since early January, is that they were not treated fairly in the allocation of seats on important Senate committees. With a 20-20 tie, it's their position that there should be parity in committee assignments, a goal that was not achieved due to the tie splitting vote of Lieutenant Governor Bolling in favor of the Republicans' proposed committee assignment plan, which was then implemented at the start of the session. Senate Democrats made it clear that they would use both the budget and the election of judges as leverage in order to force Senate Republicans to revisit the organization structure for the chamber.

The failure to adopt the Senate version of the budget bill is not in and of itself a disaster as the Senate will get another opportunity to act when the House version of its biennial budget bill is received in the Senate early this coming week. Early indications are that Senate Democrats will likely treat the House budget bill in a similar fashion. The Senate Republicans will offer a substitute to the House budget that will mirror the Senate's budget document. However, Senate Democrats will not support the substitute. If the House budget bill meets the same fate as the Senate budget measure, there will be no vehicle to address the budget before the General Assembly.

Governor McDonnell is free to send a bill down at anytime to restart the budget negotiations if necessary, but it is a more likely scenario, that the 2012 General Assembly will go home without a budget for the state. This could obviously create a serious crisis; i.e., a state shutdown come July 1 if a budget is not adopted. There is a great deal of negotiation, compromise, and political gamesmanship that will take place between now and the conclusion of the Regular Session of the General Assembly and quite possibly beyond (if the General Assembly is unable to agree to a budget, Governor McDonnell will likely call a special session to address the budget impasse).

LEGISLATION OF INTEREST:

Transportation Funding:

The two transportation funding bills still under consideration by the General Assembly, HB 1248 sponsored by Delegate Scott Lingamfelter (R-Prince William County) has been referred to the Senate Finance Committee where it will likely be conformed to the provisions found in SB 639, sponsored by Senator Frank Wagner (R-Virginia Beach). The bills are radically different in their approach to transportation funding, with the largest single difference being the use of a greater share of sales tax revenues to transportation (HB 1248) versus and indexing of the gas tax (SB 639). The House has already conformed Senator Wagner's measure to Delegate Lingamfelter's bill and sent it back to the Senate. The Senate has rejected the House substitute and will request a committee of conference in an attempt to address the significant differences in the two bills. Discussions with both House and Senate members indicate that a compromise over a significant revenue source for transportation is unlikely. The House is unlikely to embrace anything connected to the gas tax, while the Senate (both Republicans and Democrats) have rejected increasing the commitment of general funds (via a greater share of the sales tax) for transportation.

Mechanics Lien:

The VUHCC continues to closely monitor House Finance Committee Chairman Bob Purkey (R-Virginia Beach) on his Mechanics Lien bill (HB 1265). VUHCC have helped to negotiate a compromise on the bill, which as introduced would have created a new filing requirement for all contractors and subcontractors in the process of securing a mechanics lien (the bill would have required notice to be recorded at the courthouse with the clerk

before filing a lien). Delegate Purkey's bill as amended allows for notification to an owner of a property regarding the intent to perfect a mechanics lien through the contact information available on the builder's permit. The bill is currently being considered by the Senate Courts of Justice Committee. It is our understanding that other interest groups are attempting to kill the bill in the Senate Committee. We will continue to track the developments on this bill.

The VUHCC is also tracking another mechanics lien bill (HB 928), which is sponsored by Delegate Scott Lingamfelter (R-Prince William County). Delegate Lingamfelter's bill will allow contractors to obtain a mechanics' lien for site development improvements. VUHCC was able to secure amendments to the measure to ensure the bill protected the interest of our members. Unfortunately, the Senate Courts of Justice Committee included amendments that undue the work VUHCC has done on the measure. Delegate Lingamfelter asked that the Senate amendments be rejected at our request. The measure will now be the subject of a committee of conference.

Overweight Trucks:

Delegate Joe May's (R-Loudoun County) HB 806, which provides a method of assigning cost-based fees predicated on the amount that a vehicle is overweight, is on its way to passage in the Senate. The bill passed out of the Senate Transportation Committee unanimously, and will pass out of the Senate early this week.
