

2014 Final Legislative Report

Dear RAMCA Members:

Please find attached the final legislative report of the 2014 session. As you will note the legislature adjourned last Saturday without having completed its most important task - approving a two-year state budget. The hang-up has to do with expanding Medicaid in Virginia, and the reasons for the deadlock are philosophical, practical and political. But for whatever reasons, the state will begin to close down its operations on July 1st if a new state budget is not approved before that date. As a result the Governor has called legislators back for a "special session" later this month in an effort to break the logjam and arrive at some compromise between republicans and democrats on the issue of Medicaid expansion.

A number of important items did get addressed at this session. Ethics reform legislation passed which will make it much harder for legislators and their immediate families to accept gifts without reporting same. Mental health issues were front and center after the wounding of a state senator by his son and the son's subsequent suicide. As a result of this tragedy a number of important improvements in the process of evaluating, holding, and treating seriously mentally ill patients were enacted. In addition, bills to increase the minimum wage were defeated, Sunday hunting was approved, the \$64 annual hybrid car fee passed just last year as part of a much larger transportation funding package was repealed, and the number of Standards of Learning tests administered to public school students was reduced.

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Final Report for the 2014 General Assembly Session

Despite the notable legislative accomplishments during the past 60 day legislative session (including reforms in a number of critical areas such as the Standards of Learning, mental health, and ethics) the 2014 Regular Session will be known for what wasn't accomplished, namely, passage of the \$96 billion biennial budget bill. The failure of the General Assembly to agree on a budget comes as no surprise given that the red-hot rhetoric surrounding the Medicaid issue has dominated the time and attention of the General Assembly members and Governor McAuliffe for the entire legislative session. All 20 Democratic members of the Senate, along with three senior Republican members have insisted that the budget include language that would provide premium assistance to a portion of Virginia's uninsured population which would enable them to purchase private health insurance. The House Republican leadership has called the Senate language an ill-conceived

proposal that is nothing more than an expansion of Obamacare. House Republicans have insisted that with only one tenth of one percent separating the two chambers from agreement on the budget, holding the budget (and all of the core services funded from it) hostage to Medicaid expansion is unacceptable. The Senate and Governor McAuliffe argue that with Medicaid accounting for approximately 21% of the state budget, and the Commonwealth losing \$5 million a day as a result of the failure to close the coverage gap for uninsured Virginians, the budget is absolutely the proper venue to have this debate.

With the adjournment of the Regular Session this past Saturday, Governor McAuliffe has called a Special Session for March 24 to resolve the budget impasse. A quick resolution to this standoff remains unlikely. House Republicans have insisted on consideration of a “clean budget” that does not include language regarding Medicaid expansion (House Republicans pledged to “consider” the Medicaid issue in a separate Special Session if it is separated from the budget). Both the Senate and Governor understand that absent the specter of a state government shutdown on July 1st due to the failure to adopt a biennial budget, there is no impetus for the House Republicans to seriously consider addressing the Medicaid issue. Both sides are digging in for what appears to be a protracted battle of wills (the Governor is crisscrossing the Commonwealth visiting hospitals and free clinics to discuss the importance of expanding Medicaid, while House Republicans are leaning on local governments to pass resolutions calling for the Medicaid issue to be separated from the budget negotiations). This standoff shows no signs of being settled any time soon.

One important area of agreement between the House and Senate is the issue of ethics reform. Both chambers unanimously approved SB 649 sponsored by Senator Tommy Norment (R-James City County) and HB 1211 sponsored by Delegate Todd Gilbert (R-Shenandoah County). These bills create an Ethics Advisory Council to oversee Virginia’s disclosure system, and place a \$250 cap on tangible gifts from lobbyists and anyone with business before the state (entertainment and meals as well as travel for educational purposes are not included in this cap figure). It is unclear if Governor McAuliffe will offer any amendments to the ethics reform package agreed to by the General Assembly.

In addition to the March 24th special session dedicated to the budget, the General Assembly will reconvene again April 23rd for the “Veto” Session when the House and Senate will act on any amendments or vetoes offered by Governor McAuliffe on legislation passed during the 2014 Regular Session. In addition to acting on amendments and vetoes, it is also expected that the General Assembly will consider the appointment and reappointment of certain judges.

Legislation of Interest

Prioritization of Transportation Projects:

Delegate Chris Stolle (R-Virginia Beach) sponsored HB 2, which provides for the development of a prioritization process for projects funded by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB). Specifically, the measure prescribes that funding allocations for the Northern Virginia Highway Construction District and the Hampton Roads Highway Construction District be made by giving priority to the projects expected to provide the greatest congestion reduction relative to the cost of the project (the funding allocations for the seven other highway construction districts would be made by giving priority to the projects expected to provide either congestion relief or promote economic development). The bill won unanimous support in both the House and Senate, and was a collaborative effort with Secretary of Transportation Aubrey Layne. The Secretary’s efforts on the measure’s behalf would indicate that Governor McAuliffe intends to sign the bill.

Hampton Roads Transportation Accountability Commission:

Delegate Chris Jones (R-Suffolk) and Senator Frank Wagner are the patrons of HB 1253 and SB 513 respectively, which create the Hampton Roads Transportation Accountability Commission. The measures passed with strong bi-partisan margins (in the House, approximately 15 members voted against the bills due in large part to pressure from the TEA Party who distrusted the powers being conferred upon the newly created entity and argued that the creation of the Commission provides a layer of unneeded bureaucracy). The Commission is designed to manage regional transportation planning in Planning District 23 (which is the Hampton Roads region), and is comprised of the chief elected officers of the governing bodies of the 14 localities in the region along with, two senators, three delegates, and four non-voting ex officio members. The measures also move the responsibility for approval of projects and the priority of projects from the Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization to the newly created Commission. Governor McAuliffe supports the creation of the Commission, so it is expected that he will sign the measures into law.

Heavy Weight Vehicle Operation and Road Equipment Crossing Bridges:

The Governor has signed Delegate Ed Scott's (R-Madison County) HB 415, which allows local authorities to issue permits authorizing the operation over the highway of truck cranes that exceed the maximum weight specified in Article 18 of Chapter 10 of Title 46.2 relating to weight limits for truck cranes. The measure mandates that no application for a permit can be denied because of the applicant's refusal to remove such counterweights or other manufactured equipment. VUHCC also drafted and successfully lobbied a number of amendments to Delegate Scott's HB 509 which will allow road contractors to cross bridges more easily when performing road work on both sides, but not on, the bridge or other structure. This bill passed and also has been signed by the Governor.

Stormwater Management:

The House and Senate unanimously passed HB 1173 and SB 423 patroned by Delegate Keith Hodges (R-Urbana) and Senator Emmett Hanger (R-Augusta County) respectively. These stormwater management bills represent a compromise initiated by a number of rural localities throughout the Commonwealth. The bills allow any locality that does not operate a municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) to opt out of establishing Virginia Stormwater Management Programs (VSMP). The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) will operate a VSMP on behalf of any locality that does not operate a regulated MS4, which are mostly rural localities. The bills defer the VSMP requirement for six months for certain localities that became a regulated MS4 on or after January 1, 2014. The bills alter the permitting appeals process and allows for an agreement in lieu of a stormwater management plan, and directs the State Water Control Board to adopt regulations relating to the issuance of permits for parcels in subdivisions and the registration of single-family residences. The bills also provide that the consolidation of state post-construction requirements into Virginia's General Permit shall not modify the scope of enforcement of the federal Clean Water Act and exempts from most requirements of the Administrative Process Act those regulations of the State Water Control Board that will be necessary to implement the act. The bills exempt single-family residences from payment of DEQ's portion of the fee for the state general permit. The provisions of these bills will become law upon the signature of the Governor due to the emergency clauses attached to each of these measure (the Governor will likely sign the bills in the next several weeks).

Procurement:

VUHCC will want to keep a close eye on the deliberations of the Joint Subcommittee Studying Procurement. This joint, House and Senate study committee will be reviewing a number of procurement bills that were referred to the Subcommittee during the 2014 Legislative Session. Among the issues that will be examined over the next several months are:

narrowing Virginia's cooperative procurement rules; increasing the term contract limits for architectural and engineering services, and allowing certain specified factors other than price to be considered in the award of transportation construction projects.
